RESOURCE MINISTRY

One-time expenses related to organ repair and grounds maintenance resulted in a slight budget deficit for May, 2019, our first deficit in several months. In May, 2019, revenues totaled \$18,113.71. Expenses for the month totaled \$18,193.22. This resulted in

a deficit for the month of \$79.51, reducing our year-to-date surplus to \$4.618.53. This year-to-date surplus stands in stark contrast to the year-to-date deficit of \$5,967.23 at the end of May, 2018. This constitutes an improvement in the budget situation of \$10,575.76 over last year at this time.

Responsible stewardship of our resources, coupled with a prudently allocated and judiciously managed portfolio, leave us well poised to continue our philanthropic and humanitarian endeavors while making the budgetary adjustments needed to implement the Compensation Package of a newly Called Pastor, effective August 1, 2019.

As this will be my last monthly report as Resource Ministry Elder, I wish to thank the Congregation for giving me the honor of once again serving Zion on the Church Council.

As my term comes to an end, I welcome John Rhodes to the Ministry and exit the Council with a renewed and enhanced sense of respect for those who choose to serve Zion Lutheran in many capacities and with the knowledge that we are blessed to have talented, dedicated people serving as Treasurer, as Deacons and on our Financial and Audit Committees.

This month I have one story to share and a Call to Action.



The story comes from the June 2019 Issue of "Living Lutheran". It is the story of Pastor Adam White, who is the Campus Pastor at the University of Nebraska – Lincoln. He sits down in the middle of campus every week to make himself available to whomever needs him. His sign says "Rant at me about Religion I'll Listen. It is the beginning of

conversation that is important in his work. "I've prayed,

offered pastoral care, and laughed with students that never would have walked into the Lutheran Center." Pastor White. This seems like it might be really hard but it is clearly an important part of Pastor White's ministry. Many of you will remember Zach, the musician from Akron that we have had come play several times, has a new song. The chorus of the song is "What matters is the Love you VOLUNTEER." Love being volunteered is the Holy Spirit Alive in the world. That has to be the right answer. I think that is what Pastor Watt has been talking a lot about outreach this spring. Usually in his last question before turning to the Creed. "How does Zion______?" He always asked it in a slightly different way depending on the scripture text but it generally came down to "Reach out to our Neighbors". I have an idea about that. This is the CALL TO ACTION!



I want to start a program of mini-missions. I want to find something we can do in Northeast Ohio each month or so. I want to cut people's lawns, I want to make soup for homeless folks, I want to facilitate community discussions. I also believe that if people see us out there DOING they will say, "Well that church is always somewhere doing something! They must have their stuff together.
