We have also been taking care of God's physical church and property during this time. #### **CARING MINISTRY**

O Lord, help us to extend ourcaring to all people regardless of race and gender. Give us strength and grace that we will combat unjust behavior as it occurs in our everyday lives Amen.

The Zion Food Pantry client numbers have decreased by 19 households in May. This reflects a decrease of 17 adults, without children over April. The number of children dropped from 30 to 24. However, it still appears we are servicing new families with children. The total number of adults served indicates some of our regulars are still not coming. I am attributing this decrease to the stimulus checks and extra unemployment benefits and expect these people to return when these programs end. During May we served 136 people from 70 households. The May client breakdown was as follows: 24 children (0-17), 52 adults (18-59), and 60 seniors (age 60+).

As we open up, I expect our new food distribution procedures to continue for the foreseeable future. Please wear your mask and stay as safe as possible. Your chances of getting the virus with a mask are around 4% as compared to 17% without.

FOOD PANTRY needs cereal, spaghetti sauce, crunchy peanut butter, jelly (any flavor except grape), canned fruit (especially canned pineapple), canned vegetables, hot cereal such as individually packaged flavored instant oatmeal, chunky soup, and creamed soups of all kinds (no tomato soup).

#### Thanks are in order for one and all!

Considering the current economic climate, your support enabled Zion May financial results to improve significantly. Our May giving rate increased 51% compared to 2019, and our YTD giving rate has improved by 33% vs 2019. May's rate was 21% greater than April, with both being substantial improvements over our 1<sup>st</sup> quarter results. These trends are very positive and are enabling us to operate in a fiscally responsible manner to help Zion address and weather this health crisis while continuing to adequately support our ministries.

Considering this rate of giving and our budgeted expenses, May results produced an operating income of \$3,226.75; a welcome sign compared to our previous 2020 monthly deficits. This OI reduced our YTD budget deficit to \$23,087.85, when offset by 2019 surplus of \$7,646.18 produces 2020 YTD Net Income of -\$15,441.67 (deficit). This result is in alignment with our approved 2020 budget projections, but we anticipate that it will continue to be reduced as the giving trends continue.

Our resumption of in-person worship on June 7 was a very welcome event and gave you an opportunity to observe the various church infrastructure improvements which were accomplished during the stay-at-home time frame. Similarly, we want to assure you that Zion will also continue to function in a virtual manner and we will continue to support our expanding ministry functions. We encourage your continued financial support to accomplish these objectives and count our blessings that you can assist to the extent that you have demonstrated you can manage.

**Update:** Our newly established electronic giving options continue to operate successfully, now accounting for 20% of total May giving volume. 


Imagine me and you, I do

Heroes...

Do the Unexpected, Take Action, Step Out on Faith, Save the Day and Stand for Truth.

In this year's lessons the kids will meet people in the Bible who were everyday, ordinary people that God chose to use as heroes – a servant girl, some smelly shepherds, a Roman Centurion, a young boy and Paul's nephew. These lessons teach the children that God uses people like us to do great things for him, and that no matter how young or how old someone is, and no matter how big or small the deed, God uses all of us as his heroes to do his work.

#### **HERO HEADQUARTERS LESSONS:**

Monday: Heroes do the Unexpexted

Bible Lesson: 2 Kings 5:1-14

A servant girl was captured from her home, taken to a foreign country and forced to serve Naaman. Instead of having hard feelings toward her captors, the servant girl **did the unexpected** and told Namaan's wife how to have Naaman's leprosy cured. The young girl trusted in God's power to heal and spoke up because she wanted Namaan to be healed.

**Tuesday: Heroes Take Action** 

Bible Lesson: Luke 2:1-20

It's Christmas in July! The shepherds **took action** and went to see the baby Jesus after the angels told them of the birth. When the shepherds saw baby Jesus, they were so excited and went to tell everyone about the birth of our Savior Jesus and praised God.

Wednesday: Heroes Step Out on Faith

Bible Lesson: Matthew 8:5-10, 13

A Roman Centurion went to Jesus to ask him to heal his servant who was very ill and suffering. The centurion **stepped out on faith** and told Jesus he knew Jesus could heal his servant without Jesus actually seeing him. Jesus praised the centurion's faith and healed his servant.

Thursday: Heroes Save the Day Bible Lesson: John 6:1-13

A young boy was willing to share his meager lunch of five loaves and two fish. Jesus used this boy's lunch and performed a miracle. This lunch was used to feed more than 5,000 people, and everyone had as much fish and bread as they wanted. This young boy saved the day by simply sharing his food

Friday: Heroes Stand for Truth Bible Lesson: Acts 23:12-24

Paul's nephew **stood for truth.** Paul's nephew overheard a group of Jewish men who were plotting to kill Paul while he was in the Romans' protective custody. His nephew quickly went to Paul and told him of the conspiracy. Paul sent him to tell the Roman commander what he heard. Because of his nephew's willingness to tell the truth, Paul was moved and saved.

#### You can also be heroes in service this summer, and all year long! How? Here are a few suggestions:

- At Zion, we are always collecting food for our Food Pantry, gently used clothing & household items for our Clothing Closet, pet supplies for the Humane Society, and school supplies for the community and Wernle Youth & Family Treatment center.
- Support local charities financially
- Help a neighbor in need (maybe with yardwork, getting them food or groceries, visit with them outside)
- Do chores or help your parents, grandparents and friends
- Write notes of encouragement to people
- Make cards for people who are sick or are in nursing homes
- Write thank you letters to our military, police, EMS, firemen, doctors and nurses
- Make no sew blankets and scarves for people



Have you read parts one and two? Was your curiosity piqued? Did you do anything in response?

Did you do anything to be part of the solution?

Let us begin this month in prayer, using the Prayerful Commitment from Chapter Four

God, give my church and me a heart for our community. Let me see the people through your eyes. And give me the courage and the wisdom to let go of this church, so that others who best reflect hits community can lead us and teach us. Amen. p29

Let go of this church? Let those in the community lead what this church does? In a word; Yes! Our author posits that "God called the church to look outwardly." Occasionally, a congregation will reach out to the community and ask the residents to come to the church. But, why don't people from the community come flocking in? You see, many of them don't feel comfortable coming into a church because they feel like their ideas and needs will not be heard or accepted – especially, if it's different from what's going on in the church already. They observe that there is almost never any effort by the church to go into the community, instead the church expects the community to come to it.

Does your church try to reach and minister to its community, even to the point of giving up authority to better reach the people? How? or Why not? P30

Chapter five discusses one of everyone's favorite topics in a church – money. Our author states; "For where the money of the church goes, so goes its heart." Look at the budget of a church; on what is the money spent? Well, there's the mortgage, utilities, office supplies, Sunday school supplies, staff and pastor wages, and building repairs. All typical expenses for running a church. But wait, there's more! Where are the costs of service to those outside the church? In other words; How much of the church's budget is for internal verses external uses? Too many churches no longer ask how the church can make a difference for the Kingdom of God with the money.

Does your church spend more money on keeping the building and staff functioning or on going out to fulfill the Great Commission (Matthew 28:19-20)? What are some ways your church can move its use of funds from predominantly an inward focus to more of an outward focus? P36-37

At the end of each chapter, the author, offers a Prayerful Commitment. Perhaps we are willing to start there – prayer. Please join your Council and Pastor with this Prayerful Commitment from Chapter 5:



Lord, help me to grasp that all the money I think I have is really yours. Help me to grasp that all the money our church has is not the church's, but yours. Give us healthy giving hearts to use these funds according to your purpose. Amen. P36
