

Message from your President:

October is our congregational meeting. The meeting will be on Thursday, October 29, 2020 at 7:00PM. We changed it to a Thursday since we have our services, and Bible discussions on Wednesday. The meeting will be covering the annual report and voting on the purposed budget for 2021 In accordance with our constitution, any approved changes to an amendment have to be ratified at the next annual meeting by a two-thirds vote. So if you approved the change in the amendments at the special congregational meetings in September, we will be ratifying the amendments at this meeting. Please make every effort to come to the meeting. We have a lot of important things to discuss. The annual report and the budget will be sent out to everyone two weeks in advance. Please bring these to the meeting with you. There will be time to answer any questions you may have on the annual report. This year the annual report will also include some future plans of the ministries, not just what we accomplished in the last year.

I know with COVID-19 it is harder for people to come out. We will be taking all safety precautions for you. We are to be stewards of all God's things. A steward is someone who takes care of someone else's things. We are to take care of God's things. God created everything. All is His not ours. CARING MINISTRY

During the month of August, the Food Pantry served 83 households as follows: seniors (age 60+)

75, adults (age 18 - 59) 61, and children (birth -17) 24. The total number of people served during August was 160. During August we served 6 less households consisting of 13 more people than July. We had 35 less total clients than August 2019.

As we continue after Labor Day and the start of school, I suspect the number of COVID-19 cases will spike; therefore, stay safe.

instant oatmeal, hearty/chunky soup, and creamed soups of all kinds.





Wednesday evening or Sunday. Equally, we also wish God's peace and love to those who do not feel comfortable with attendance utilizing our safe protocols. Please stay in touch and let us know what we can do for you.

Zion's August giving rate rebounded for a 21% increase compare to July and increased 85% compared to August 2019; a very positive result for which we are thankful for your generosity and stewardship. Our YTD giving rate continues on a positive trend with the August result 46% increase compared to 2019 results. The detrimental economic aspects of the pandemic continue to be a factor but overall, our trends are positive and will enable us to continue to operate in a fiscally responsible manner to help Zion address and adequately support our ministries. Your continued support will make this happen!

Considering rate of giving and our budgeted expenses, August results produced an operating income deficit of \$2,663.31. This result was a consequence of necessary roof repairs whose negative budget impact will be reversed in September accounting. This result increased our YTD budget deficit to \$24,385.55 prior to accounting for our 2019 budget surplus of \$7,646.18. This result is in alignment with our approved 2020 budget projections, but we anticipate that it will continue to be reduced as the positive giving trends continue for the remainder of 2020.

FYI: Our established electronic giving options continue to operate successfully, accounting for approximately 10% of total August giving volume. Stewardship Moment – It's not about money.



Is this MEME what you think of when you hear; Stewardship?

Well, we have good news for you! It's not about money.

In a recent gospel reading we heard Jesus tell the parable of the laborers in the vineyard (Matthew 20:1-16).

Let's walk through that parable for a moment:

- * Some think the landowner represents God; for the landowner is generous and treats all equally.
 - That seems reasonable.
- * The landowner asks; "Am I not allowed to do what I choose with what belongs to me?" (v15).
 - He means everything belongs to the him; the land, the grapes, the wages.
- * So, if the landowner represents God, then does that mean everything belongs to God? Now you understand; well done!

So, stewardship is about recognizing, accepting, and admitting that God owns everything – God is, after all, the Creator.

WHAT IS A NAMED ENDOWMENT?

A named endowment is a fund a donor establishes with the ELCA Foundation to provide perpetual support to ELCA ministries, congregations and organizations. Establishing an endowment fund in your name or the name of a loved one is a great way to establish a legacy and ensure support to ministries you specify for years to come.

Here's how it works:

A named endowment fund is established through the ELCA Foundation through your work with a regional gift planner. It can be funded with an immediate gift or a multiyear gift commitment, or through your estate plan. Many families choose to establish a named endowment through a current gift, planning to grow the endowment with additional gifts, memorials and estate gifts.

A named endowment can be named after yourself, a family member or someone influential in your life whom you want to honor through your perpetual support of ministry. Up to 10 charitable beneficiaries may be listed in a named endowment fund, including qualified 501(c)(3) organizations unrelated to the ELCA. This makes the fund a great tool for providing perpetual support to the ministry, congregation or local organizations you care about most. All named endowment funds are invested in the ELCA Endowment Fund Pooled Trust, ensuring that your funds will be managed according to the ELCA's socially responsible investing guidelines.

Stewardship Moment – Title of Ownership.



You don't have what you have because you earned it or deserve it.

No, you have it because ...wait for it... because God trusts you to care for it properly. God lets us tend to God's creation.

"God said...<u>let</u> (humankind) have dominion over the fish of the sea, and over the birds of the air, and over the wild animals of the earth, and over every creeping thing that creeps upon the earth (Genesis 1:26).

God trusts us to take good care of that which belongs God. We are God's entrusted caretakers. Does that biblical fact match the verbiage you use to reference things in your care?

REPORT TO ZION EVANGELICAL LUTHERAN CHURCH RE: 2020 NEO Synod Assembly held September 11-12 Submitted by Cindy Bagocius, Delegate

The theme for the 2020 Synod Assembly was "Faithful Witness—John 4." In the reading of John 4, we meet the Woman from Samaria drawing water from the well—not only for her own needs, but also for the need of a thirsty Jesus. She and He engage in an extended conversation which led to her running off to the village to tell whoever would listen, she had met the Christ. She is the faithful witness of John 4.

Attendees at the Synod Assembly, in its virtual form, were witnesses to much.

Way before home-based delegates settled in on their respective devices for the Calling to Order of the Assembly by Bishop Allende, much time, energy, know-how, and not-yet-know-how had to fall into place. Delegates were encouraged to "attend" online orientation sessions hosted by Synod personnel to become familiar with both ZOOM formatting and Turning Point Technologies voting procedures. The three of us from Zion—Susan Whalen, Pastor William, and I—met two times ourselves prior to the Assembly's dates, to foster and establish rapport. Pastor William was recruited to be a member of the HELP DESK team stationed at the Cuyahoga Falls Synod Office. Key organizers and speakers were on site at the John S. Knight Center in Akron.

As a postage stamp-sized delegate, I still felt a part of the whole. Each day's events followed its printed Agenda very closely—much to the relief of everyone who had a hand in putting together all the elements at stake in the online format. The very few glitches were handled with patience and "aplomb"—Bishop Allende's new word!


