

January begins a new secular calendar year. It is a time when Zion's Council and Congregation reflect upon the past year's trials and tribulations and contemplate the challenges and opportunities presented by the coming year.

MINISTRY REPORTS



CARING MINISTRY

During the month of November the Food Pantry served 175 households consisting of a total ogether We Can! of 408 people. As a comparison, 125 households with 295 people

were served during October 2021. The adults without children have increased by 37 people, while the seniors without children added 9 people. The seniors with minor children have basically remained the same, while the adults with minor children have increased by 35. The number of children served in November also increased by 35. November 2020 we served 163 households In with 341 people; therefore, we have increased our outreach by 7% more households and 16% more people respectively over last year. The November numbers are reflecting the annual Thanksgiving increase which will continue through Christmas. An additional explanation for these numbers comes from a Food Bank Seminar which identified our zip code 44720, as one of the neediest in our area.

The blood supply is currently critical in our area. Our next church drive is Sunday January 16th, 2022. Please contact Debbie Fox for scheduling or help scheduling if you cannot schedule on the Vitalant site.

Now that the holidays are over, our community outreach continues. Many of our team members and leaders cover multiple teams and ministries; therefore, if you are not currently involved with one of our teams or ministries, please consider helping.

Thank you everyone for your continued support of all our Caring Ministry Teams.



Pastor's Ponderings January, 2022

Yes! A new year! A time to put the past behind us and look ahead to what could be a great year. What, I ponder, might the new year hold for us here at Zion? Here are four powerful cornerstones I hope you too will ponder:

1. Church Growth

Might this be the year we see some *more people participating in the life of* this congregation outside of the worship hour? Might we see more children <u>and</u> adults in Sunday School, expanding their relationship with God and each other? Might more of our neighborhood community see us as an integral part of their life and participate in our community events.



2.

Sign, sign, everywhere a sign



What are the signs of this congregation? Signs point to, or identify something; its location and purpose. What do our signs tell our community? Do they send a message of love and a place where they will be protected and valued? To us, the cross represents love, grace and inclusion; how do we send that message to our community?

3. Somebody ought to...

Often we see something amiss, or notice that something didn't get done and say; Somebody ought to fix that, or pick that up, or do that differently, or..., the list is endless. Perhaps it might be better to for us to ask; *How might I be part of the solution*? What might I do to bring excitement and enthusiasm to worship? What might I do to encourage and support the people already doing so much here? How might I participate in some small way to share and show the love of Christ?



4. The 80/20 Rule



It is often said that 80% of the work in a congregation is done by 20% of the people. But we are fortunate; we have about 44% of the people doing God's work with their hands. They are preparing and serving congregation meals, organizing and serving at our community events, building quilts, sending cards, setting up and cleaning up the chancel, organizing and serving the Shared Goods place, setting up and serving the Food Pantry, and taking leadership roles on Task Forces, Ministries, Council, worship assistants, sound/video technicians, and music leaders. They go above and beyond;

might you make the time to let them know you appreciate the work they do to make this a vital congregation?

Christians are called to not be conformed to this world's ways, but to be transformed by the renewing of our minds, for the sole purpose of discerning God's will (Romans 12:2.) How will you renew your faith this new year?

The Twelve Days of Christmas

In another *I Didn't Know That*, we'll take a look at what the church means when it refers to the Twelve Days of Christmas, but for now let us consider the song by that name.

First, some brief myth busting information:

1. This is <u>not</u> a Christian song written in a time that it was unlawful to be a Christian. The earliest known printed version dates back to the late 18th Century children's book *Mirth Without Mischief*. In this time period, it was not unlawful to be Christian. Certainly, there were clashes between the Roman Catholic and Anglican churches in England, but both of them were Christians with very similar tenants; particularly the common symbolism attributed



2. This was <u>not</u> written to be a method to memorize Christian symbolism – just look up the various meanings associated with some of the items (see below.) The symbolism is all a bit confusing for something designed to help one memorize something.

Now that I burst your bubble about the false Christianity of the song, here is some common held symbolism:

Partridge in the Pear Tree = Jesus

Two Turtle Doves = Old and New Testament

Three French Hens = Faith, Hope, and Love/Charity, or Holy Trinity, or Three Gifts of Magi

Four Calling Birds = Four Gospels or Four Evangelists (Matthew, Mark, Luke and John)

Five Golden Rings = Pentateuch (first five books of the Bible)

Six Geese A-laying = \sin days of creation

Seven Swans A-Swimming = seven sacraments (though some Christian denominations have only two) or the seven gifts of the Holy Spirit: wisdom, understanding, counsel, might/fortitude, knowledge, fear of the Lord, and piety (Isaiah 11:2-3, though piety is not mentioned specifically)

Eight Maids A-milking = eight beatitudes (but, there are nine in Matthew 5:3-11, and only four in Luke 6:20-22)

Nine Ladies Dancing = nine fruits of the Spirit: love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, generosity, faithfulness, gentleness, and self-control (Galatians 5:22, NRSV)

Ten Lords A-leaping = ten commandments (though we know there are actually 613)

Eleven Pipers Piping = eleven faithful apostles (we could argue Judas' faithfulness, and what about Matthias who replaced Judas, and what about Paul who claimed apostleship?)

Twelve Drummers Drumming – twelve points of doctrine in The Apostles Creed (quick, name all twelve)

Bottom line; if this song helps you feel joyful at Christmas; OK, just don't let it replace good old fashioned knowledge about the Bible.

"Miracle on Acme Road"

It was a time for miracles this past October, as the annual Lutheran World Relief Ingathering for the Northeastern Ohio Synod brought forth an unexpected turnout of donations. Held at Jerusalem Lutheran, Seville, donors from sixty-three congregations throughout the synod exceeded the expectations for kits and quilts. "It felt like a last-minute miracle," beamed Pastor Tina Crog, the pastor of Jerusalem Lutheran, "...normally, we receive enough donations to fill up half a semi, and this year, we re-

ceived enough to fill an entire semi!" That demonstrated great significance due to the current supply chain crisis. According to Pastor Crog, if the semi had only been half-full as it usually was, they would have had to wait until the following week for kits to go out. "The semi would have had to go to another pick-up site, then come back for our kits. That is because of the current lack of semis. We would have had to load then unload our kits and keep them somewhere until the truck came back." Thankfully, due to the generosity of donors, they were able to get kits to people in need much faster than planned.

Phyllis Kreider, the receptionist for Jerusalem Lutheran, also commented on this year's amazing ingathering, "Things went quite well. We've been doing this for thirty years, and people are always so grateful to have a place to bring things." This year especially, due to the pandemic, the ingathering seemed to carry out a little more importance than in previous years. For instance, there was a church that had over two years of things to bring because they didn't get to participate last year. Ms. Kreider noted, "I'm sure that our synod wasn't the only one who experienced something like this. It is times like this, we certainly feel we need to keep doing this as long as we can."




