

# **Ministry Reports**

#### **CARING MINISTRY**

During the month of September, the Food Pantry served 131 households consisting of a total of 312 people. As a comparison, 116 households with 245 people were served dur-



ing August 2021. The adults without children have increased by 30% while the seniors without children only added four people. The seniors and adults with minor children have basically remained the same. The number of children served in September increased by 84%. In September 2020 we served 91 households with 176 people; therefore, we have increased our Ministry by 44% more households and 77% more people respectively over last year. The September numbers are back in line with our July numbers; therefore, it is hard to determine any trend.

Laura Thompson's Feed a Friend Team is up and running. Request for service forms are available in the office.

**FOOD PANTRY**—November's items of the month are turkey gravy, boxed mashed potatoes,



and cake mixes for our pantry families. Please drop off by Sunday, November 14th before our Thanksgiving giveaway. Thanks to everyone who donated to the food pantry last month. We always need our staple items

- peanut butter, creamed soups, jelly (except grape), pasta, spaghetti sauce, canned fruit, and

boxed cereal or instant oatmeal because these items are given out regularly. Thanks for your support!

SHARED GOODS PLACE is getting a new face lift. We have added racks across the walls in the first room next to Pastor William's office and



across the brick wall in the second room. We have also changed the table in the hallway for kitchen goods. We have added 3 more rolling racks for sweaters and coats so we can get them out of the choir room. We have put all the children's clothes in the first room. The clothes for women and men, bedding, towels and curtains are in the second room. We are planning on having 8 racks or so which will enable us to move them in and out of the gym on Care Team night and Food Pantry day. This will make it much easier to put up and tear down for these times. We are still in need of household items such as: bath towels, hand towels, tea towels, dishes, pots, pans etc. We need boys clothing sizes 5 to 18. We are collecting new underwear and socks in all children and adult sizes. Thank you for your support of items, volunteer time and your prayers for our ministry.

#### RESOURCE MINISTY




May the Lord's countless blessings shine upon you and grant you Peace! The weather's cooler, leaves are turning and a multitude of ministry activity at Zion are happening this Fall. For October, the inaugural Art Show was a hit, the Craft Show was a success and Trunk or Treat was delicious for all of us candy lovers. The Art and Craft Shows provided intended revenue to help support our commitment to Habitat for Humanity Faith Build 2022. Your enthusiastic physical and financial support enabled these events to become the effective community impact ministries we envisioned. We know we can count on your continued resource sharing to make the year-end holiday schedule of events as memorable.

Financially, September Giving was disappointing although comparable to 2020. Generally prudent cost control kept our expenses within budget limits, but two extraordinary expenses of a new hot water heater and parsonage roof, combined with the depressed giving, to produce a significant monthly operating deficit. Our Year-to-Date Giving continues to be ahead of 2020, but at a similar deficit level, so our Giving needs to increase substantially to fund our year-end 2021 operations and ministry plans. We need a repeat of your generous 2020 year-end giving pattern to be successful and eliminate our deficit.

It has been very evident in our 2021 Giving pattern that there may be some misunderstanding of where Zion's Giving is allocated to Zion's operation.

• When your giving is "General or Unrestricted", we can utilize these receipts for any appropriate purpose, but particularly to support our Operating Budget. This pattern of Giving provides us with the necessary flexibility to meet any/all our budgetary and operating needs. Maintenance of this category ensures that Zion is not operating at a deficit.

- **Designated** Giving is utilized for the specified intended purpose of various operation or ministry expenses, but it constrains our ability to satisfy other important areas of operation.
- Restricted Giving is utilized for the specific intended purpose of benevolence and is aggregated and distributed accordingly. This benevolence is very desirable and beneficial, but it does not positively impact Zion's financial operations.



Operation problems are created when **Total Giving** is an acceptable magnitude but the distribution between the three sources are skewed to **Designated** or **Restricted** at the expense of **Unrestricted**. This is the detrimental circumstance which has been evident for the last four months. Our desire is not to reduce **Designated** or **Restricted** Giving, but to consider them as "additional" instead of "in place of" **Unrestricted** when you are exercising your Giving options.

We are thankful for your continued support and Giving to continue the "Good News" with our operations and community ministries. It is also important to remember that if you are planning to utilize Advance Giving in your tax strategies, these contributions need to occur before the end of the year.

Lord, thank you for the inspiration and availability of sufficient resources to do your work at Zion and in our community. Help us to recognize the needs and to appropriately respond to them. We do this in honor of your name, Amen.



# Programs and Resources to Amplify Your Impact

#### How to apply for a Thrivent Action Team

Your passion and excitement for your community are sure to make your Thrivent Action Team a success. Follow these steps to apply—and don't forget to share the impact of your project with us.

- Visit <u>thrivent.com/actionteam</u> for resources to help you brainstorm ideas and prepare for your project.
- 2. Once you have your project idea, get ready to apply. Here's what you'll need to have handy when you fill out the application:
  - Your User ID and password.
  - Your estimated project date. (Allow 14 days for the review of your application and the shipping of your Thrivent Action Kit.)
  - A short description of your project and how your volunteer team will be involved.
  - The church or other nonprofit organization that will benefit from the project, if applicable.
  - How you'll use the Community Impact Card.
  - Number of volunteers on your team and T-shirt sizes.
- Now that you have everything you need, visit thrivent.com/actionteam and click Apply Now to begin the application process. Applying for a Thrivent Action Team takes less than 15 minutes.
- If it is your first time logging in, you will need your Thrivent ID. If you don't know your Thrivent ID, please contact your Thrivent financial professional or call 800-847-4836 for assistance.

After you've completed the application, watch your email inbox to see if your project was approved. You should receive an email within 24 hours of submitting your application.

#### After your project


