### MINISTRY REPORTS

### **CARING MINISTRY**



During April Zion served 30 households with minor children, within this group 11 clients were seniors and 61 were adults. The combined number of children served was 77. Also during April we served 117 households without minor children and within this group 105 clients were seniors and 82 were adults. Therefore, during April, Zion served 147 Households consisting of 336 clients. April accounted for 13 additional households and 16 additional clients over March 2022. As a comparison in April 2021 we served 121 households consisting of 290 clients representing a 21% increase in households and a 16% increase in clients over last year. The need is still great and slightly higher than March and April last year.



June Item of the Month – we would like to collect boxed cereal for our pantry families this month. We always need our staple items – peanut butter, creamed soups, jelly (except grape), pasta, spaghetti sauce, canned fruit, and boxed

cereal or instant oatmeal because these items are given out regularly. Thanks for your support!

### RESOURCE MINISTRY

He is Risen! He is Risen indeed! Alleluia! Mother Nature has been very fickle with the turbulent weather, but Spring is in the Air and it has been rewarding to see how many of you have been attending our services! This is visible evidence of the Holy Spirit at work here at Zion, and further evidence is documented in our ministry activity.

Thru May, we have successfully completed the 2<sup>nd</sup> of 3 work sessions for the Habitat for Humanity Faith Build (3<sup>rd</sup> to finish in June), held Vitalant Blood Drive event, made tangible/visible progress on the Kitchen Renovation and have plans in place to consummate the Parsonage Sale for June. This is in addition to the extensive support required for our bi-monthly Food Pantry distributions. It is invigorating and inspiring to see these plans being executed and rewarding when they are completed having a positive impact on our Zion congregation and our extended faith community. Your physical and financial support allow us to accomplish these positive examples of sharing God's peace, love, and blessings each day with others. **Thank you!** 

Our April Giving results were 4% less than March but 57% greater than February, 36% greater than January and 10% greater than April 2021 reinforcing reversal of the very disappointing trend starting 2022. However, these results are still insufficient to meet our monthly budgeted weekly target (\$6,200 actual vs \$7,000 budget) to achieve a balanced operating budget for the year. You can each assist in reducing this deficit by a small increase in giving (up to 10%) with the combined impact being significant. Our combined April Giving was sufficient to meet our nominal April expenses accounting for extraordinary items for Kitchen Renovation which have subsequently been reimbursed from our Merrill Lynch investment account per approved plan.

The coming months have ministry events, i.e. Summer Bible School, Cruise-In, etc, which have

been budgeted for and will be executed as planned. Your General Giving will allow us to do this in a financially responsible manner as long as we are 2022 budget levels. We look forward to your enthusiastic support to accomplish our mission to spread God's love and blessings to the community of faith.

Lord, we are humbled by the resources you continue to make available to do your work at Zion and the inspiration you provide to recognize needs in our community and to appropriately respond to them. We do this in honor of your glorious name, Amen.






# Pastor's Ponderings June, 2022

In mid-May I participated in wider-church events: national Anchor Church training and our Synod Assembly. Time with my colleagues from across the country and lay and rostered folks from across our synod reinforced what I've been hearing about the church – decline of church as we came to love it in the 1960s. That got me to pondering:

- How has the world changed in the past 60 years?
  - o The Berlin Wall (1961-1989) exists only in the memory of people born more than 40 years ago
  - The USSR (1922-1991) dissolved, but its current leader is focused on regaining the former glory
  - O Homes in the 1960s averaged 1,200 square feet and cost \$31,500. In North Canton today, the average is 2,500 sq ft with a price of \$240,000
  - The love and peace generation of Baby Boomers (1946-1964) is now considered the "gloomiest generation" and is now focused on their volatile stock holdings and keeping the Social Security system in place as their retirement plan (which was not its purpose when created in 1935)
- Has the church changed in the past 60 years?
  - Many congregations still use the hymnal published in 1978 (green LBW), while others still hang onto the red Service Book and Hymnal (1958)
  - The church measures its success by the number of people in worship on Sunday
  - The church strives to be a welcoming place that hopes people will cross its threshold



- What might an innovative church of the 21<sup>st</sup> Century look like?
  - o Worship is organic, fully participatory, and filled with joy and reconciliation
  - The church is rooted in curiosity and concern for the world around them, seeking ways to participate in God's mission of renewal and reconciliation for the world
  - The church goes beyond its doors into the community, seeking the peace and prosperity of its neighbors



"Christians are called to not be conformed to this world's ways, but to be transformed by the renewing of our minds, for the sole purpose of discerning God's will (Romans 12:2.) How do you participate in this renewal?

### **News from our Book Discussion Group**

We are wrapping up our 2021-22 season on June 3 with a discussion of the first Harry Potter book, "The Philosopher's Stone," by J.K. Rowling. Our discussion group has read many books in the past three years; this is our first "fiction fantasy" book.

We read the book because it was one our member's picks for the year. According to the Office of Intellectual Freedom of the American Library Association, this book "was the most frequently challenged book in the US for 1999," and, "When the pastor of Christ Community Church in Alamogordo, New Mexico oversaw a book burning featuring the Rowling titles on December 30, 2001, the Alamogordo Public Library held over its *Harry Potter* display." So, what is all the hoopla about? I think you need to read the book to find out, or come to our discussion on Friday, June 3, at 10 am at the Stark Library – Plain Community Branch, 1803 Schneider Street NE, Canton, Ohio 44721 – whether you've read the book or not.

I liked the ending; good triumphs over evilJ. Here is a quote from the end – Spoiler Alert!

"If there is one thing (the evil one) cannot understand, it is love. He didn't realize that love as powerful as your mother's for you leaves its own mark. Not a scar, no visible sign...to have been loved so deeply, even though the person who loved us is gone, will give us some protection forever. It is in your very skin."

The book discussion group is back to some regular classical British fiction in September followed by a haunting Gothic story; an intellectual and emotional jigsaw puzzle of a novel; a warm, charming tale about revealing oneself-warts and all; a historical novel about women's suffrage; a book called "Anxious People" by talented Swedish author Fredrick Backman; a true story about some particular elephants by a man who devoted his life to wildlife conservation, a coming-of-age odyssey, and two more yet-to-be-determined tomes.

### **Synod Assembly Report**

Day one of the Synod Assembly consisted of breakfast, lunch two worship services and two 3 hour education seminars.

Day two was reserved for all of the business sessions. After our morning prayer, we heard from the Key Note Speaker, Fr. Raymond P Guiao, President and Chief Mission Officer of St. Ignatius High School. His message was very inspiring, emphasizing how even high school students can take 5 minutes out of every day to stop and see how and where God is present in our every day lives.

Our very own Linda Weidenbach, was re-elected to the synod council as a member at large.

There were two items of business which were voted on:

- A change in the by-laws concerning the reduction of 7 conferences to 5. The purpose of this change was due to the necessity of re-aligning the conferences to equalize the demographics, due to our changing times.
  - The motion passed, and, FYI, Zion is now in the South Central Conference.
- A new "Compensation Standards" was introduced to assist congregations who are considering the call process. The new standards is supposed to be more "user friendly," making the calculations simpler.
  - This proposal also passed.

Rev. Christopher Otten, the Assistant to the presiding Bishop/Director, Federal Chaplaincy, explained the importance of our military chaplains. It seems Lutherans out-number the chaplains from other denominations. He emphasized how important this service is to our military men and women. He then presented Service Medals to two retiring chaplains.

## **Update on the sale of the Parsonage**




