

Food Pantry

During the month of September the Food Pantry served 160 households consisting of a total of 367

people. As a comparison, 155 households with 400 people were served during August 2022. September served 14 additional seniors, 22 less adults, and 25 fewer children than August. The decrease in September adult and children numbers shows the August increases were tied to the back to school supplies being offered by our Shared Goods Ministry. During September 2021 we served 131 households with 312 people. This September represents an additional 28 households and 55 additional clients over last year. With the upcoming Holiday Season, I expect we will experience high numbers based on current food costs. September numbers already show an increased need from our seniors.

RESOURCE MINISTY



God's blessings be with you all! Saturday the 22nd was such an excellent day and example of Zion's ministry in action. The Craft Show was executed in exemplary fashion under sunny skies with the large team of Zion "yellow shirt" volunteers coordinating all facets; crafters, raffles, bake

sale, set-up, clean up and especially German dinner preparations off-site since the kitchen renovation is not released to date for operation. Excellent planning and teamwork produced positive results and responses from all aspects to support our major fund raiser for **Habitat for Humanity-Faith Build 2023**. Many comments were received about why this was an example of how "Zion matters to the community by showing the love of Jesus Christ."

The month of October was tied to our Stewardship campaign "Building a Culture of Generosity" with activities to remind us what God's abundant provisions for us can accomplish if we share them and not take them for granted in our daily lives. The results are not complete, but we have met the Council Challenge Goal of 50 Intent Cards returned and generated an additional Council gift of \$5,000 to our General Fund. Also, more than \$35,000 additional Giving has been pledged for 2023 Zion ministry and the amount continues to grow. Thank you for joining us in "Building a Culture of Generosity". We intend to implement this Stewardship campaign annually.

September giving results were substantially improved over August (62%) and dramatically improved over September 2021 (131%). Thank you for this very positive response! This response brings YTD Giving to 15% greater than 2021. This rate of giving allows us to post positive monthly Net Income of \$13,426 when accounting for adjusted expenses from the Kitchen Renovation and allowing us to reduce YTD Net Income deficit to \$48,946.

We are encouraged by the increasing trajectory in our giving pattern and trust history will repeat itself and that the final three months of the year will produce our highest giving rates. October results to date indicate this to be true and we trust that you will continue to make this a reality. Doing so will ensure that we are properly funded to make a difference and matter in our community by sharing the love of Jesus Christ in our year-end ministries.

The Council proposed 2022-2023 Budget presumes that we will continue to execute the increased Giving level demonstrated to date and realize the Stewardship intent pledges. With this input, we look forward to your prayers and support in sharing God's Blessings and improving the lives of members and the community. God bless you in this pursuit.

Lord, we are humbled by the resources you continue to make available to do your work at Zion and the inspiration you provide to recognize needs in our community and to appropriately respond to them. We do this in honor of your glorious name, Amen.

Duane told us about the history of Refuge, their transfer from their old building into their present building and their ministries. They were able to build their new facility debt free. We were able to tour their facility. They have a dining room that serves about 130 people at one sitting. They usually do two sittings for their dinners and lunches. They have

I look forward to hearing what you've been pondering. Graciously, Pr. William




