To eliminate this emotional turmoil we need only to look outward and view the world around us through the lens of the Church calendar year. This is a time of transition between Christmas and the Season of Advent and the Lenten Season culminating in the Crucifixion of Jesus and His Resurrection as the Risen Christ. This is a time when we reflect on the life of Jesus, Who never saw the need to make New Year's resolutions. We are filled with awe by the incomprehensible magnitude of God's Love for the human race. A Love so all encompassing that He sacrificed His Only Begotten Son to wash away our sins and give us the promise of eternal life. From the beginning-the very beginning- Jesus' life was an irreversible, unalterable, unstoppable march to the Cross. Adult Sunday School




WORSHIP & MUSIC MINISTRY

Let's Talk About Words

Everyone can do something. Some can physically participate. Some can prayerfully participate.




Some can financially participate. All can do something, and that is what we are called to do as Christians.

I look forward to hearing what you've been pondering. Graciously, Pr. William $\ensuremath{^{10}}$







They are so appreciative of the food we give them because it helps free up money for other important expenses. It is a constant reminder of how important it is for us to share God's love and help our community, especially now with the cost of groceries. The food and support that we are able to give makes a big difference in the lives of many!
