Message from our President:

March is the month in which our thoughts turn to St. Patrick's Day, the end of Winter and the milder, longer days ushered in by the Spring Equinox on March 20. This year, the month of March coincides with twenty-seven of the forty days of Lent, a time when Christians prepare for the celebration of Easter. The word Lent is derived from an old English word, "lencten," meaning "to lengthen," and was used to refer to Springtime, when the days lengthen. The forty days of Lent symbolize the forty days and nights Jesus spent in the desert, tempted in the wilderness, after His baptism. We Christians trust in God's abundant Grace and know that by His death on the Cross and Resurrection Jesus delivered us from sin and showed us the way to eternal life. We know that we are sinners, cognizant of the ever present need to confess and repent. Lent is intended to be a time when we focus on doing exactly that. We do not practice confession and penance to earn or keep our salvation. Our salvation was accomplished through Jesus' sacrifice. We confess and repent because we truly want to live the lives of service to others that Christ has set us free to live.

The Lenten Season is an opportunity to rethink the fundamental purpose of our lives and to gratefully contemplate the deliverance from sin and promise of eternal life sanctified by the Risen Christ. Through our Lenten meals and worship services we in the family of Zion hope to make these days of Lent an intellectually enlightening and morally stimulating experience that instills in all of us a renewed sense of awe and wonder for the Blessings bestowed upon us by our Divine Creator and which fortifies us in our journey to be the people God is calling us to be

Lord, make us ever mindful of our need for confession and repentance, ever grateful for the promise of eternal life and ever desirous of living our lives in a manner consistent with Your will. In Jesus' Name we pray. Amen.

Food Pantry

During the month of **January** the Food Pantry served 113 households consisting of a total of 247 people. As a comparison, 144 households with 323 people were served during December 2022. January served 31 fewer households consisting of 74 fewer people than December. Also,30 fewer children were served in January. During January 2022 we served 102 households consisting of 262 clients. January 2023 had 11 more households, but 15 fewer clients than last year. It is interesting that during November, December, and January, our categories: Households, Total Clients and Total Children dropped by the same approximate number each month from the November 2022 high. Thank you to all our supporters and volunteers, you make this Ministry possible.

Pastor's Ponderings March, 2023

March Madness. No, not the basketball version, but the Lent version. There is much to ponder:

• Lent begins by recognizing our terminality and origin – dust. God created us from dust, but not just any old dust, the dust God created at the beginning of time. The very same dust God used to create Adam (Genesis 2:7). Wow! Forget Ancestry.com and all their fancy science, we've got the Bible to show us the land from which we originated. Are you more concerned with the fanciful characters of your family tree, or that God made dust so that God could make you?



• Lent gives us opportunities to contemplate that we are the reason God sent Jesus to die. For God so loved everyone and everything that God sent Jesus to fix the broken relationships we made between ourselves and each other, between ourselves and God's creation, and between ourselves and our parental loving God. Are you more concerned with continuing a way of life that presents opportunities for conflict with fellow humans, damages the earth, and keeps God restricted to small aspects of your life, or will you open every aspect of your life to God's will?



 Lent evening fellowship and worship gives us additional opportunities to draw closer to God and to one another. Through contemplative prayer, and silence, worship will help us put the busyness and selfishness of the world in its proper place; allowing us to make intentional room for God. Are you more concerned with doing all those worldly activities or will you make time for God?



Lent presents us with the opportunity to disconnect from business as usual. It gives us the opportunity to connect with God's plan for us and the world. It gives us the opportunity to remember our proper place in God's kingdom. Will this be the opportunity to grow your discipleship? I pray that your search for God will be genuine, for when you search for God with your whole heart God will be found (Jeremiah 29:13).



Everyone can do something. Some can physically participate. Some can prayerfully participate. Some can financially participate.

All can do something, and that is what we are called to do as Christians.

Jesus calls us to spread the kingdom of heaven here on earth. What new way will you make that happen this year? God is counting on you.

I look forward to hearing what you've been pondering. Graciously, Pr. William




It's a Sanctuary; or is it?


Did you know the space where we worship on Sunday is not a Sanctuary? Many people, including pastors, misuse the name Sanctuary to describe that space. So, you may wonder, if it's not a Sanctuary, what is it? Read this article and you might find yourself saying; I Didn't Know That.

Many churches have multiple areas in the worship space (see diagram), at Zion there are four:

- <u>The Narthex</u> the area between the outside doors and the doors into the worship space.
 - ♦ from the Greek word *narthex* which means "giant fennel"
 - ♦ the portico on a Jewish temple was called *narthex* because it resembled a large hollow fennel stem
- The nave the area where people actively participate in worship (it is not a space to sit, but a space to actively sing, pray, speak, respond, and interact with one another and with God.) It contains the aisle and pews, and is the largest area.
 - ♦ from the Latin word *navis* which means; ship.
 - $\,\diamond\,$ the early church used a ship as a symbol for the church
 - ⋄ if one looks up at our ceiling, and disregards the air duct, one might visualize an upside-down ship's hull
- - ♦ In some churches the chancel is separated from the nave by a railing with lattice work. In our space it is separated from the nave by the first set of stairs.
- <u>The Sanctuary</u> the area surrounding the altar. It is considered a place set apart from the
 world, a sacred place where we encounter God. The altar is the place where God is present in a
 very special way; the body and blood of Jesus.
 - from the Latin word sanctuarium, which means a container for keeping something cherished and important
 - Our church was remodeled several decades ago to move the altar from what was the sanctuary (up the second set of steps). The altar is generally in a place separate from the chancel and contains nothing but the altar. Our setup is a bit different from the typical setup. See a separate article about this.

For simplicity, we refer to the whole area as the Worship Space, for that is what is done in the nave, chancel and sanctuary. Now you know.





Holy Week begins with Palm Sunday and proceeds through the four days of Maundy Thursday, Good Friday, and Resurrection Sunday. This is the defining season of Christianity and you are encouraged to grow closer to your Savior by fully participating in all four worship experiences.



Palm Sunday, Wednesday March 29 at 7:00 pm and Sunday April 2 at 9:00 am

On this day, united with Christians around the world, we mark Jesus' triumphant entry in to the holy city of Jerusalem to complete the work of our salvation. We follow his footsteps as we enter the church, our Jerusalem, acclaiming the one whose throne was the cross.

Worship Pattern: we gather with palms and joy to hear the reading of Jesus' entry into Jerusalem. Worship continues in the usual pattern.



Maundy Thursday, April 6 at 7:00 pm


On this night we begin the Three Days during which we participate once again in the saving power of Jesus' passing over from death into life. The Maundy Thursday service includes the words of Jesus' new commandment (*madatum*, from which *Maundy* comes) to love one another. On this night in which Jesus was handed over to death we also gather around the Lord's supper. At the service conclusion, the altar area is stripped of furnishings as a sign of Jesus' abandonment.¹

Worship Pattern: we gather in the gym to experience the Living Last Supper and join with our First Communicant in receiving Christ's body and blood. Service concludes with silent procession to the worship space where we sing *Were You There*, followed by the solemnity of stripping the chancel.



Good Friday, April 7 at 7:30 pm

On this night, the journey continues through the Three Days of Jesus' suffering, death, and resurrection. At the heart of this service is the passion reading according to John, which celebrates Christ's victory on the cross. As Jesus draws all people to himself, we pray for the whole world for which Christ died. Finally, we honor the cross as the sign of forgiveness, healing, and salvation. With all God's people we are invited to before this mystery of faith. Christ has died, so that we may live.



Worship Pattern: we gather in silence, pray for one another, hear God's Word, glorify the cross, and ponder what Christ did for us and the whole world.

Resurrection Sunday, April 9 at 9:00 am

Every Sunday in worship, the church celebrates the life, death, and resurrection of Jesus Christ. The Holy Spirit gathers us to receive again the gifts of God that come to us through Christ, the saving Word. On this day, we rejoice anew. Easter is the day of all days. The tomb could not keep Jesus. As Christ is risen, we too shall be raised. Come, join with all the faithful across the world as we raise our voices in triumphant song and share the meal of Holy Communion which Christ set before us. Alleluia! Christ is Risen! He's Risen indeed! Alleluia!

Hopefully, the weather will continue to improve and reward us with brilliant sunshine on Easter Sunday to celebrate our saviors' resurrection. Don't let our recent dismal weather negatively impact your daily interactions. Look for, and take advantage of, every opportunity to model the way and share the "Good News" as we utilize our resources with the Zion community.

It was such a pleasure to see the smiles on faces and animated discussions taking place during Scout Sunday when the Boy Scout troop was added to our congregation ministry. Their enthusiastic participation in service, and your recognition and hospitality, were especially rewarding to see in action. Their addition and integration to the Zion community should be very fulfilling for all. Thank you for your positive support. Excellent work good and faithful servants!

Our January giving results were substantially improved over January 2022 (66%) providing an excellent start to 2023. This giving set the foundation for improved financial results with a small \$1,000 monthly operating deficit. Several expense budgetary variations prevented us from having positive net income for the month. This is the 6th consecutive month of improvement compared to prior year. Thank you for continuation of this very positive response!

Our Stewardship campaign, "Building a Culture of Generosity" will continue to be a point of emphasis throughout 2023. Detailed assessment of giving patterns to date indicate most are executing Intent Card commitments reflecting increases in 2023 giving rate. Your spiritual, physical, and financial support is critical for us to accomplish Zion's ministries and share the good News with our community. Faithfully honoring these commitments will ensure that we accomplish our ministries in a fiscally responsible manner. Opportunities abound for us to make 2023 a safe, happy, and healthy year of sharing our resources to positively impact our community. Your individual contributions will ensure it happens.






