

This year we at Zion will celebrate Holy Week from April 2 through April 9. **Food Pantry**—During the month of February the Food Pantry served 144 households consisting of a total of 322 people. As a comparison, 113 households with 247 people were served during January 2023. February served 31 additional households consisting of 75 more people than January. Also, 24 additional children were served in February. These numbers reverse the January losses from December 2022. February 2022 served 134 households consisting of 360 clients. February 2023 had 10 more households, but 38 fewer clients than last year. Thank you to all our sponsors and volunteers that make this Ministry possible.

As I reported our Food Client numbers had dropped off in January; however, they returned in February to December 2022 levels with several new clients. This reflects the loss of the SNAP program which may have affected some households with a loss of \$200.00 or more in their monthly food budget.

### WITNESS MINISTRY



We are expanding the garden this year. We will be building 12 more beds on Saturday, March 25<sup>th</sup> from 11-2. We also will be replacing some original beds in the main garden on Hillcrest Road on April 15 from 12-2.

We have the existing garden full again this year and a few of the new beds already accounted for. We have 10 of our gardeners returning this year. (4 of which are from the congregation)

We are recipients along with the Hillcrest Garden to a "Creating Healthy Communities" grant from the Stark County Health Department. This will be used for our expansion and mulching of the garden along with various improvements. We have agreed to provide 5 beds to be used for the food pantry. We will be keeping track of how much food is provided. We had a group from Starbucks in Washington Square contact me. They were looking for a service project they could do so they will be mulching our garden in April.

I have contacted the boy scout troop at the church to see if anyone is interested in earning an Eagle Badge by building a wooden fence and gate around the garden this year.

I had one of the boy scouts contact me last year about doing an eagle scout project so he made an information booth for us. We will be dedicating it sometime in June. I am so excited for how our community garden is growing and seeing how much it is helping the community. I'm excited about all the plans we have for it this year.



**Holy Week** begins with Palm Sunday and proceeds through the four days of Maundy Thursday, Good Friday, and Resurrection Sunday. This is the defining season of Christianity and you are encouraged to grow closer to your Savior by fully participating in all four worship experiences.



**Palm Sunday**, Wednesday March 29 at 7:00 pm and Sunday April 2 at 9:00 am

On this day, united with Christians around the world, we mark Jesus' triumphant entry in to the holy city of Jerusalem to complete the work of our salvation. We follow his footsteps as we enter the church, our Jerusalem, acclaiming the one whose throne was the cross. **Worship Pattern:** we gather with palms and joy to hear the reading of Jesus' entry into Jerusalem. Worship continues in the usual pattern.

#### Maundy Thursday, April 6 at 7:00 pm


On this night we begin the Three Days during which we participate once again in the saving power of Jesus' passing over from death into life. The Maundy Thursday service includes the words of Jesus' new command-ment (*madatum*, from which *Maundy* comes) to love one another. On this night in which Jesus was handed over to death we also gather around the Lord's supper. At the service conclusion, the altar area is stripped of furnishings as a sign of Jesus' abandonment.<sup>1</sup>

**Worship Pattern:** we gather in the gym to experience the Living Last Supper and join with our First Communicant in receiving Christ's body and blood. Service concludes with silent procession to the worship space where we sing *Were You There,* followed by the solemnity of stripping the chancel.



#### Good Friday, April 7 at 7:30 pm

On this night, the journey continues through the Three Days of Jesus' suffering, death, and resurrection. At the heart of this service is the passion reading according to John, which celebrates Christ's victory on the cross. As Jesus draws all people to himself, we pray for the whole world for which Christ died. Finally, we honor the cross as the sign of forgiveness, healing, and salvation. With all God's people we are invited to before this mystery of faith. Christ has died, so that we may live. **Worship Pattern:** we gather in silence, pray for one another, hear God's Word, glorify the cross, and ponder what Christ did for us and the whole world.



#### Resurrection Sunday, April 9 at 9:00 am

Every Sunday in worship, the church celebrates the life, death, and resurrection of Jesus Christ. The Holy Spirit gathers us to receive again the gifts of God that come to us through Christ, the saving Word. On this day, we rejoice anew. Easter is the day of all days. The tomb could not keep Jesus. As Christ is risen, we too shall be raised. Come, join with all the faithful across the world as we raise our voices in triumphant song and share the meal of Holy Communion which Christ set before us. Alleluia! Christ is Risen! He's Risen indeed! Alleluia!

Sadly, that joy is short-lived as we recognize the reality of what awaits Jesus after his final entry into Jerusalem; the cross, for our sake.


Before we celebrate the Resurrection, we are called to remember that Jesus' suffering and death demonstrates God's love for us.

Our weekly Bible Memory Verse: Make me to know your ways, O Lord; teach me your paths. Psalm 25:4



#### Food Pantry Update

First, thank you to all of the volunteers who help set up, serve and tear down for Food Pantry each time. What a great group of volunteers! Our Food Pantry friends are so grateful, especially now as they are seeing food costs continue to rise along with the loss of extra funding that they received during the pandemic.





