Food Pantry— During the month of **March** the Food Pantry served 138 households consisting of a total of 299 people.

As a comparison, 144 households with 322 people were served during **February 2023**. March served 6 fewer households and 23 less people than February. Also,12 fewer children were served in March. Because of the high cost of food and loss of benefits it is hard to gauge the actual current need. Over the next three months I hope we get a clearer picture of what is going on. During March 2022 we served 134 households consisting of 320 clients. Thank you to all our volunteers that make this Ministry possible.

What an amazing day, the sun is shining emphasizing Peace and God's blessings with you all, and yet some snow flakes are in the air!

Holy Week and Easter was such a positive experience, energizing all celebrating the resurrection of our Lord and Savior. Spring weather continues to be difficult to predict but days of brilliant sunshine and warmer temperatures are becoming more frequent, bringing all of God's creation into bloom reminding us of the beauty that is produced by sun, water and the Holy Spirit's tender care. We encourage you to utilize each of your daily interactions to share this "Good News" as we support our Zion community.

Our 2023 Stewardship campaign, "Building a Culture of Generosity" continues to be a point of emphasis. Zion Giving patterns year to date indicate the vast majority are executing their Intent Card commitments with 2023 giving rate exceeding 2022 levels. Your 1st quarter Giving Statements document recorded 2023 Giving so that you can assess your giving and confirm it reflects your intended induvial commitment. Your spiritual, physical, and financial support is crucial for us to accomplish Zion's ministries and share the good News with our community in a fiscally responsible manner. We sincerely thank you for your continued support.

March giving results were a 29% improvement over February 2023, but they were reduced by 12% compared to March 2022. These mixed results combine to produce year-to-date Giving rate which is 18% ahead of 2022 levels. This provides a more optimistic financial foundation to 2023. March results produced an operating deficit of \$5,560 with unexpected utility increases a major factor, and year-to-date deficit of \$12,122. We anticipate a reversal of this trend when the April Easter seasonal results are factored in.

Opportunities abound for us to make 2023 a safe, happy, and healthy year of sharing our resources to positively impact our community. Your individual contributions will compound to ensure it happens.

Lord, we continue to be humbled by the resources you make available to do your work at Zion. Please provide inspiration to recognize needs in our community and to appropriately respond to them. We do this in honor of your glorious name, Amen Faithfully yours,

History of Memorial Day

Memorial Day is observed to honor the men and women who died while serving in the U.S. military. This is different from Veterans Day, a time set aside to remember those who have served our country who are living.

Originally known as Decoration Day, it originated in the years following the Civil War and became an official federal holiday in 1971. The Civil War, which ended in 1865, claimed more lives than any conflict in U.S. history. By the late 1860s, various towns and cities began holding springtime tributes to these countless fallen soldiers, decorating their graves with

flowers and reciting prayers.

On May 5, 1968, General John A. Logan, leader of an organization for Northern Civil War veterans, called for a nationwide day of remembrance later that month. "The 30th of May, 1868, is designated for the purpose of strewing with flowers, or otherwise decorating the graves of comrades who died in defense of their country during the late rebellion, and whose bodies now lie in almost every city, village and hamlet churchyard in the land," he proclaimed. Memorial Day, as Decoration Day gradually came to be known, originally honored only those lost while fighting in the Civil War. But during World War I the United States found itself embroiled in another major conflict, and the holiday evolved to commemorate all U.S. military personnel who died in all wars.

We remember those who lost their lives in battle so that we may live freely.

Because Memorial Day falls between two principle festivals of the church (Pentecost and Trinity Sunday) this year, we will not do recognition of memorial Day at Worship Service. Below are prayers you can say to honor those who have died in service of our country.

A Litany for Those Who Died in Service

On this day, we remember those who gave their life in battle so that we might lead free lives.

Prince of Peace, even as we pray for an end to war,

we give thanks for our soldiers' courage, for their love of country, and for their work to bring peace to the world.

Healer of All, bind up the wounds of all who have lost loved ones in war,

show us how to comfort those who are hurting.

Merciful God, all suffer the cost of war,

we remember widows and widowers, orphans, and all those separated from those they love.

Gracious God, help us to turn swords into plowshares, let peace reign in your world.

We give thanks for all who have given their life that we may live freely.

Almighty and ever-living God, we give you thanks for the men and women who served and defended our country and the values of freedom and justice we hold so dear. Help us be mindful of the sacrifices they made and the hardship endured by their families and friends, so that we never take for granted the privileges they secured for us. Lord in your mercy

Hear our prayer.

Eternal God, we give thanks for all those who showed the greatest love by laying down their lives for others. We especially thank you for those in our military throughout history who sacrificed their lives for their fellow citizens and for us who came after them. As we remember their service, keep us mindful of all those for whom this day is a burden, and send your spirit of comfort to them. Help us to be worthy of their legacy and keep us mindful of their service, that in all things we may live our lives in praise and thanksgiving to you. Lord in your mercy.

Hear our prayer.

Merciful God, you grieve amid the pain, fear, and suffering of your children. Look with compassion on all who endure the miseries of war. Be mindful too, of those who day and night face peril in defense of our nation. Guide them in their duties as they seek justice for those subjected to tyranny and oppression. Eternal Protector of the helpless, hear the cry of the distressed and grant speedy deliverance in a new day of peace and harmony in the whole world. Lord in your mercy.

Pastor's Ponderings May, 2023

Where did the church bells go? On my way to church Sunday morning, I pass several other church buildings. I always get to Zion early, to accomplish all those things that need being done before you folks show up, but one day I was running a bit late. Guess what I heard when I went past St. Paul Catholic Church around 7:25? Bells! It's been a long time since I heard church bells ringing. So, it got me to pondering:

- ~Why did churches used to ring their bells?
 In a book I read once, the author mentioned how a pastor friend of his said "it was so the fish could jump into the boat", a comical reference to the church's role of being fishers of people (Matthew 4:19). In the old days, the perception was that most people went to church on Sunday, and when the bells rang it was time to make your way to church.
- ~We have a bell, why don't we ring it?

 Well, I heard we stopped ringing our bell because a neighbor (who, by the way no longer lives in the neighborhood) complained. Ringing the bell probably was no longer effective in getting people to come to our church anyway, so we just stopped ringing it.
- ~Could ringing our bell make a difference to the community?

 Those in the neighborhood who go to church, go somewhere else and probably already leave before we would be ringing our bell, so it wouldn't make them come here. Those who don't go to church aren't going to come here just because we ring a bell.

Ringing a bell is a passive way of getting people to church. Jesus commanded us to "go and make" disciples (Matthew 28:19); ringing a bell is more like "sit and wait" for disciples to come to us. We can't just expect people to show up on Sunday because we ring a bell, or have a nice sign, or have nice landscaping, or...

Consider this, the only way to get people to come to Zion is...

- ...to give them something they can't get somewhere else.
- ...to get them to see there is something here for them by inviting them to "come and see".
- ...for you to be a part in the preceding two items.



Everyone can do something. Some can physically participate. Some can prayerfully participate. Some can financially participate.

How will you participate? Just show up, or actively make a difference?

Connect with God, pray for one another, remain present with people you encounter, and treat one another gently and with the love of Christ.


Stark Hunger Walk - Sunday, May 7th


