Message from our President:

The month of June ushers in the summer season and weather that encourages all of us to engage in that interaction that is so fundamental to God's plan. We enter June emotionally energized by our celebration on Sunday May 28 of the events of Pentecost, through which the Holy Spirit now dwells among us, enabling us to experience love, joy and peace, and the satisfaction that comes from serving others. Our focus is now on the need to keep a faith-filled routine in the summertime, recognizing that God is with us always- including when we are on vacation.

Maintaining a faith-filled routine requires vigilant attention to stewardship. Stewardship is not about fundraising, increasing church membership, financial management or even increasing the amount of worship service offerings. Simply put, stewardship is a recognition of the fact that we own nothing, that all we have has been entrusted to our care by God, and that we need to utilize and manage the resources He has entrusted to us in a manner that attests to His glory and augments the beauty of the world He has created. Stewardship entails an understanding of the obligation we, as Christians, have to do all we can to fortify and enhance our ability to employ the vast resources placed at our disposal to the maximum benefit of others.

God's all encompassing and never ending love for us is manifested most visibly and perfectly in His Son, Jesus Christ. As stewards, the role of Christians is to make God's love visible by imitating Jesus. The Stated Purpose of Zion Lutheran is to "Matter to the Community by Showing the Love of Jesus Christ." To ensure that our endeavors are consistent with our Stated Purpose Zion's Elders have been engaged in introspective workshops, reviewing the various Ministries' responsibilities outlined in Zion's Resolutions and By-laws to determine if they are consistent with the mission of effectively utilizing the resources entrusted to us in a way that enables us to most effectively and efficiently serve others and create an environment where all can experience the life enhancing beauty of God's overwhelming and all conquering love for the human race. We ask that the Congregation pray with us that God will give us the wisdom to discern the proper course of action to take in response to what we believe this introspective study has revealed to us.

In the coming months Zion will once again host a Vacation Bible School program, a cruise-in to benefit the Valor House for homeless veterans, and the North Canton Bike Rodeo -all of which we believe are consistent with our determination to make a difference in the community. To polish the skills needed to fortify our ability to perform our stewardship role some of us will be participating in ELCA "Vital Congregations Training" while others will be participating in the ELCA's "Stewardship for All Seasons" training. We respectfully ask for the Congregation's support in all of these endeavors.

Lord, thank You for entrusting to our care the resources needed to serve others. Help us to remain ever cognizant of Your all powerful love for us and the need to imitate Your Son in all our actions. In Jesus' Name we pray. Amen.











































BOOK DISCUSSION

Peace be with you! I trust the sun and God's blessings are shining on you all!

Easter has ended and Pentecost is beginning; Memorial Day weekend signifies the start of the summer season. It also signals the start of a number of Zion ministries; Habitat for Humanity Faith Build with "3" Saturday work days throughout the summer to help create affordable housing; VBS is on the horizon with its educational and entertaining spiritual instruction and the Cruise-In will occur in July to benefit Valor Home for homeless veterans. Each of these ministries provide an opportunity for your stewardship participation by supplying your physical, spiritual and financial resources to make them successful in achieving our mission of "mattering to the community by showing the love of Jesus Christ". We trust you will provide your enthusiastic support and participation to these activities in addition to our monthly Food Pantry and Shared Goods Place ministries which are sorely needed.

To reinforce that our 2023 Stewardship campaign, "Building a Culture of Generosity" continues to be a point of emphasis, we provided you with feedback on your execution of Intent Card commitments with a 4-month Giving Statement at end of April. More than 90% of Zion Intent Card participants are meeting or exceeding their commitments. In addition, most Zion givers are participating at levels which exceed 2022. Your spiritual, physical, and financial support is critical for us to accomplish Zion's ministries and share the good News with our community in a fiscally responsible manner.

April giving results were an 11% improvement over March 2023 and 2% increase versus April 2022. Giving year-to-date is 13% ahead of 2022 levels. April results produced an operating deficit of \$6,146 and year-to-date deficit of \$19,732. We solicit your continued positive financial support to adequately fund Zion's ministries.

Opportunities abound for us to make 2023 a safe, happy, and healthy year of sharing our resources to positively impact our community. God will assist to make your individual contributions compound to ensure it happens.

Prayer: Lord, we are blessed to consider resources you make available to do your work at Zion. Please provide the inspiration to recognize needs in our community and to appropriately respond to them. We do this in honor of your glorious name, Amen.

The Postal Service asks our communities to leave non perishable food items out by their mailbox for this event. The postal workers then collect this food on their routes and bring it back to the post offices.

In Stark County, the Stark County Hunger Task Force is the recipient of all

of the food donations. The Food Pantries that are part of SCHTF all have the opportunity to pick up this food to help supply their pantries. We were fortunate to have two post offices to collect from – Uniontown and Jackson Belden. Zion's Food Pantry received over 2,000 pounds of food from Stamp Out Hunger this year – Praise God! Thank you to the US Postal Service and members of the Stark County Community for their efforts in the fight to stamp out hunger!






2023 VBS SERVICE PROJECTS



LOOSE CHANGE COLLECTION – We will have a collection jar out each morning for the kids to bring in loose change.
