





DECIDE TO GIVE SACRIFICIALLY

Little has ever been accomplished without sacrifice. This is true in our homes, our work, our country, our church. Sacrifice is a necessary component of successful living.

And so it is with the Christian life and faith. Our salvation cost God the cross. Bonhoeffer rightly said there is no cheap grace.

Much of church giving is only token giving, averaging less than two percent of income. No wonder there is so little joy or satisfaction in it! We have given only what we could easily afford, not what we would really miss.

Experience shows that giving sacrificially is meaningful and joyful to the giver!

Each person determines what amount or percentage is sacrificial for their circumstances. Overall experience suggests that sacrificial giving begins at five percent of income, with lower proportions falling in the token giving category.

Church participation is often low, studies have shown, because personal investment in church is low – there is little sacrificial giving.

Jesus said, "For where your treasure is, there your heart will be also." (*Luke 12:34*) Where is your treasure? That is where you will find your heart.

As we prepare to return our Statements of Intent for our generosity this year in worship today, remember that all 12 members of Council shared their excitement about our ministry moving forward by contributing to a challenge gift of \$6,000 for when we receive yours and 59 other intent cards. They invite you to join them by being just as generous and faithful.

Keeping our ministry strong will enable us to dream about an ever-growing ministry into the future. Take time this week to reflect on the ways in which connection to our ministry has impacted you and those you know and love in the past year and start dreaming about what God may be up to here moving forward.



We are inundated with community expectations for how we spend God's money. We hear pleas to: buy this product, take this vacation, get a new car, purchase a bigger house, etc. But God says; you have enough, expand my kingdom, not your waistline, clothes closet or world travels.


Stewardship in practice

God trusts us to use God's money as God desires. We spend plenty on ourselves, but most of us spend very little on expanding God's kingdom. And here's the difficult part for most of us; if we are using the vast amount of our money on ourselves, we are stealing from God. How do you think God feels about that? What might God have to say to you about your spending?



Jesus tells another parable about what the kingdom of heaven is like (see Matthew 25:1-13 from last week). This time, it is about how we are entrusted with God's money and are expected to do something with it to expand God's kingdom. So, what are you doing with God's money entrusted to your care? Are you doing all the fun things you want, or are you ensuring that the proper percentage of God's money is being used as God wants? Truthfully, most of us are guilty of burying God's money in our own wants and desires.
