AM: Let us enthusiastically pray our prayer of stewardship, Holy Lord,


I gladly return, for your work, a portion of your abundant provision to me. All that I have is yours alone, entrusted Lord, to my care. Amen.

The Lord's face shine on you with grace and mercy.


The Lord look upon you with favor and + give you peace.


