#### Message from our President

In December we contemplate God's incomparable gift to the world- the incarnation of His Divine Essence and Presence in the human form of Jesus, our Savior and Lord. #### Food Pantry News - Debbie Fox

I wanted to share a few stories that happened in November that show how much we do matter to the community! A woman came in for the first time for one of our distributions. She drove by, saw our banners and stopped. She decided to come in and shop for her food and as she was talking with the volunteer who helped her shop, she explained that she is a single mother and had just run out of food. That morning she didn't know what she was going to do, but then saw our banners (the Holy Spirit at work!). When she finished picking out her food, she was in tears and could not believe what she had received. She was so grateful because the food was going to help her get to her next paycheck! God sent her to Zion and we were able to help! Thanks be to God!

The next person I wanted to share about is a single gentleman who was very nervous on his first visit with us this past month. He wasn't sure how it all worked, and decided to have us bring out pre-packed groceries instead of coming in to shop for his food. I could see he was uncertain so I stopped to talk with him before getting him registered. He was so amazed that we had given him lunch. He wasn't going top be able to have lunch that day, so this was a really big deal for him. It was a hot and delicious meal that he couldn't stop thanking us for. He then gave me all of his reusable shopping bags that were in his trunk because he did not need them and wanted to help if he could – just amazing! He was so grateful for all the groceries and was just a joy to visit with. On his second visit, he was much more relaxed and again very grateful! Thanks be to God that we could be here to feed him and show him he is loved!

Finally, as I was shopping at Aldi for our 2<sup>nd</sup> distribution in November, a woman in front of me in the checkout line looked in my cart and said, "donations?". I explained that I was getting items for our Food Pantry. She was very curious to learn about where we were, who we served and how many. She was so moved by what we do that she offered to pay for some of the items I was buying. The Holy Spirit moved her to help with our mission to feed the hungry, and I could not have been more touched and grateful for her actions. Praise God!


- There will be a normal Wednesday evening service on Dec. 20 at 7pm.



Christmas presents us with many opportunities to engage in holiday spirit. Listed below are some opportunities that just might lead to finding the true meaning and purpose of Christmas:

- Advent Sunday morning worship at 9:00 we'll gather together to Early Christians Used Greek Abbreviations! hear Jesus telling us about his coming return, John the Baptizer (that's how Mark refers to him) revealing the true light of the world, and how Jesus was at the beginning of time and had a hand in creation. The worship space and building will slowly transform into a Christmas wonderland as deco-
- Advent Sunday evening worship at 6:15 (preceded by a communal meal at 5:30) we'll gather together in the form of Evening Prayer, where we will join in the ancient form of prayer, scripture and song that seeks to connect us closer to God With Us (Emmanuel). The third week, will be led by our children as they tell us the story of Jesus through the use of Chrismons.







# **STEWARDSHIP** FOR ALL SEASONS

God's plentiful blessings be with you all! The chill in the air and the frost on our windshields remind us that winter is just around the corner. Fortunately, frequent sunny skies have made the days inspirational reminders of God's positive impact on our well-being. It makes for glorious start to the coming holiday season.


Your positive support and approval of our proposed 2024 Spending Plan during the October 22 Congregational Meeting provides an opportunity for you to demonstrate support for our planned 2024 ministry activities. Pastor William passionately and eloquently documented the Stewardship challenges necessary to support this plan, as well as the appeal for your participation in our Fall 2023 stewardship campaign, "Stewardship for All Seasons".

Your enthusiastic, prayerful support and submissions of the stewardship Intent Card have begun on Sunday November 19. The initial response has been 50% of our card submission goal, translating into a significant projected increase to our General Fund Giving. General Fund Giving supports Zion operations and ministry activities. The coming days will establish our cumulative response, and you will be kept abreast of the impactful results with email updates. The final totals will also be summarized in the January newsletter. We are committed to utilize Zion's combined spiritual, physical and financial resources to enable ministry events which align with our mission, "Zion matters to the community by showing the love of Jesus Christ."

Trunk-or-Treat 2023, WOW! Threatening skies pushed us inside and forced some last-minute organization, but the results were amazing. 530, yes 530, community youth, parents, and grandparents, enjoyed themselves in very festive costumes, young and old alike. They were amazed and appreciative of the range of sweets, food and drinks. Many smiles were in evidence, for both the attendees and the multitude of Zion volunteer participants. This has become a major community event that we need to leverage for additional community initiatives. This will be on the agenda for 2024.

Our October giving results were disappointing. One disastrous week of giving destroyed an otherwise positive month producing a monthly deficit and increasing our Year-to-Date ("YTD") operating deficit. Our YTD Giving is currently 4.5% greater than 2022 but it is an insufficient rate to eliminate our current budget deficit. On one hand, 64 percent of Zion Giving members are giving at a rate which is more than 110 percent of their 2022 levels, and 74 percent are giving at rates greater than 2022. This is excellent and in alignment with our 2023 approved budget of 10 percent increase; however, the current total giving YTD is 10 percent less than our budgeted amount producing noted deficit. Cost controls have been implemented to minimize the negative impact, but the solution is an increase in Zion total giving rate. We believe this will happen in November and December and it will come to fruition with your generosity. 2024 Intent Card submissions will be a positive impact; please submit yours to ensure our success.

We are encouraged by your support of the 2024 Spending Plan, but we are especially looking forward to your enthusiastic participation in Stewardship for All Seasons to enable our successful execution. Doing so will ensure that we are properly funded to make a difference and matter in our community by sharing the love of Jesus Christ.
