



March 31, 2024, Resurrection Sunday





Let us confess our faith in the words of the Nicene Creed

We believe in one God, the Father, the Almighty, maker of heaven and earth, of all that is, seen and unseen. We believe in one Lord, Jesus Christ, the only Son of God, eternally begotten of the Father, God from God, Light from Light, true God from true God, begotten, not made, of one Being with the Father; through him all things were made. For us and for our salvation he came down from heaven, was incarnate of the Holy Spirit and the virgin Mary and became truly human. For our sake he was crucified under Pontius Pilate; he suffered death and was buried. On the third day he rose again in accordance with the scriptures; he ascended into heaven and is seated at the right hand of the Father. He will come again in glory to judge the living and the dead, and his kingdom will have no end. We believe in the Holy Spirit, the Lord, the giver of life, who proceeds from the Father and the Son, who with the Father and the Son is worshiped and glorified, who has spoken through the prophets. We believe in one holy catholic and apostolic church. We acknowledge one baptism for the forgiveness of sins. We look for the resurrection of the dead, and the life of the world to come. Amen.

hear our prayer.

Loving God, we pray for all communities of faith and for your Spirit in our midst. Feed us at your Easter table and fill us with your wisdom, that we may serve and care for others. God of grace, **hear our prayer.**

Eternal God, we remember those who have gone before us in death. Renew our trust in your promises, that we live with joyful courage and compassion. God of grace, **hear our prayer.**




AM: Let us enthusiastically pray our prayer of stewardship, Holy Lord,

Give us this day our daily bread; and forgive us our trespasses as we forgive those who trespass against us; and lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from evil. For thine is the kingdom, and the power, and the glory. Forever and ever. Amen.

AM: Let us enthusiastically commit to our mission as we pray,




PM: The Lord bless you and keep you.



In today's gospel reading we hear about three women who encounter a "young man, dressed in a white robe" in the tomb of Jesus who tells them that Jesus was raised from the dead. The gospel ends abruptly with the women fleeing from the tomb, saying "nothing to anyone because they were afraid." The first words in this gospel are that it is "The beginning of the good news of Je-sus Christ", but this ab-rupt ending certainly isn't the end of the good news of Jesus Christ. We know it's not the end because the good news has been told to us, and we contin-ue to tell it to others.


