



We give you thanks, O God,


for in the beginning you created us in your image and planted us in a well-watered garden. In the desert you promised pools of water for the parched, and you gave us water from the rock.





hear our prayer.


Into your hands, most merciful God, we commend all for whom we pray, trusting in your abiding love; through Jesus Christ, our resurrected and living Lord. **Amen.**

The Offering of our tithes, gifts and sacrifices is gathered for the mission of Christ's church, including the care of those in need.




AM: Let us enthusiastically pray our prayer of stewardship, Holy Lord,


AM: Let us enthusiastically commit to our mission as we pray,

What is that tall candle and why is it lit during Easter?

What is it called?

- It's proper name is; Paschal Candle (some, mistakenly call it the Christ Candle, which is a wholly different thing).
- Paschal means Easter. It comes from the Greek word pascha, which is derived from the Hebrew word pesach, meaning Passover; refer to Exodus chapter 12.

What does it mean?

- The Paschal Candle represents Christ' triumph over the darkness of sin and death.
- Fire has long been a sign of God's presence; one well-known example is the burning bush Moses encountered on Mount Sanai.
- Early Christians viewed the kindling of a new fire as a symbol of the resurrected Lord's presence amongst them.
- The Jerusalem church of the first Century blessed and lit candles every Saturday night, to be used in their celebration of the Resurrection the following day.

How is it used?

- At worship services during 50 days of Easter (Easter Sunday through the Day of Pentecost), the Paschal Candle is placed near the altar as a symbol of Chris's resurrection.
- After the Day of Pentecost, the unlit Paschal Candle is placed near the Baptismal Font as a reminder that through our Baptism we are crucified and resurrected with Christ.
- At Baptism services the Paschal Candle is lit and a small candle is lit from it and presented to the baptized or their sponsor as a visual reminder of the integral connection between Baptism and Easter,
- At Funerals the Paschal Candle is placed near the head of the casket as a reminder that "In our Baptism we have already died and been raised with Christ." (Romans 6:3-5)

Luke 24:36b-48 Stewardship Moment from Pastor William



Stewardship in the Gospel The newly risen Jesus appears to his disciples and gives them marching orders: proclaim forgiveness of sins in my name to all nations. God wants all people forgiven so they can have a new life of freedom from the captivity to sinful ways; freedom to be in a right relationship with God and with each other.

Stewardship in our Community

Our community could use some freedom. Not freedom to selfishly do as one wants, but freedom to do what is good for the benefit of all and for creation. Martin Luther told us that God doesn't need our good works, but our neighbors do. Jesus freed us so we could do those good works.

Stewardship in practice

Let us use our freedom to make a difference in our community. See God's abundance as a way of doing things to benefit others. Maslow's Hierarchy of Needs identifies things you can help make a reality for others: safety and security, love and belonging, and self-esteem. Look deeper at those three needs and ask God to help you have the strength and courage to do something for someone else that fulfills a need. God will give you the answer, and the ability.
