


April 21, 2024 - Fourth Sunday of Easter

Christ is risen indeed. Alleluia! Joined to Christ in the waters of baptism, we are raised with him to new life. Let us give thanks for the gift of baptism.


We give you thanks, O God,

To you be given honor and praise through Jesus Christ our Lord in the unity of the Holy Spirit, now and forever. Amen.










Let us pray.



The King of Love My Shepherd Is

PM: Let us confess our faith in the words of the Apostles' Creed.

I believe in God, the Father almighty, creator of heaven and earth. I believe in Jesus Christ, God's only Son, our Lord, who was conceived by the Holy Spirit, born of the virgin Mary, suffered under Pontius Pilate, was crucified, died, and was buried;

he descended to the dead. On the third day he rose again; he ascended into heaven, he is seated at the right hand of the Father, and he will come to judge the living and the dead. I believe in the Holy Spirit, the holy catholic church, the communion of saints, the forgiveness of sins, the resurrection of the body, and the life everlasting. Amen.

hear our prayer.

Gracious God, help all communities of faith to listen for your voice. Call us away from things that distract us from following you. Invite us to more deeply love and serve people who are lonely, isolated, and on the margins. God of grace,

hear our prayer.



Living God, we give thanks for our ancestors in faith. Strengthen us to share the good news in our own day. God of grace,


hear our prayer.

Into your hands, most merciful God, we commend all for whom we pray, trusting in your abiding love; through Jesus Christ, our resurrected and living Lord. Amen.




AM: Let us enthusiastically pray our prayer of stewardship, Holy Lord,

In today's gospel reading, Jesus claims to be the good shepherd. He goes on to explain that while a hired-hand shepherd cares for and protects the sheep of his flock, Jesus wants to care for and protect all sheep – even those not part of his flock. Indeed, he desires those oth-er sheep to be part of his flock. Jesus wants all sheep (people) to belong to his fold. Christianity is not an exclusive club for select people; it is for all people - even those you might not want to sit next to in church.
