
Lift up your hearts






The Weekly News of Zion Lutheran Church



In today's gospel reading we hear about Jesus appearing to his disciples on the night in which he was risen from the dead, and then he appears again a week later, this time Thomas was there too. But the last two verses are an important addendum from the gospel writer. These last two verses tell us the purpose of the book: to give us enough information that we "may come to believe that Jesus is the Messiah, the Son of God." And, that by believing we will have life; the life God desires for us. Read, believe, share; repeat.

Stewardship in the Gospel

In today's reading, Jesus says that those who believe in him, even entrusted to our care though they didn't see him with their own eyes, are blessed. The gospel writer, John, tells us the purpose of his book is to tell us enough of the signs Jesus did so that we may come to believe in Jesus so that we may have life. There we have it; the truth, believe it, be blessed with life.

Stewardship in our Community

Our community could use the good life. Not the kind the commercials are trying to sell us, but the good life that comes from a relationship with Jesus. The good life that cares for others, the greater good, and the whole of creation.

Stewardship in practice

How can we get others to believe in Jesus? Quite simply; act like Jesus. Care about others, work toward the greater good, and be good caretakers (stewards) of creation. That will require some changes on our part. Changes that put the benefit of others above our own benefit. But we can do it. Remember, God's counting on you to help make God's kingdom come.
