

## **Food Pantry News**

In March, we ordered over 5,000 pounds of food from the Akron Canton Regional Foodbank to be distributed to our pantry families. We also received over 200 pounds of donations from our congregation, members of our community, and our friends at Community Christian Church in North Canton and North Canton Grace. We served 158 families that included 364 people in March with those items.

We recently had our annual Pantry inspection by Linda Steinhebel from the Akron Canton Regional Foodbank, and received the following email:

## John Rhodes - Resource Ministry

God's plentiful blessings be with you all! Are you ready for Spring to be sprung in earnest, I am! The diversity of occasional frigid temperatures with interspersed forms of precipitation is getting very old creating opportunities for colds, sickness, etc. I am praying that we will have fitting weather for Holy Week and Easter's culmination celebration of our Lord's resurrection. I trust you participated in all our Holy Week opportunities and celebrated the joy that they inspire.

Our February Unrestricted ("General Fund") giving results were positive and a continuation of our strong January giving pattern. Thank you! February 2024 was 10% greater than 2023, combining with our strong January results to create YTD Giving Rate which is 23% ahead of 2023. Unfortunately, our utility bills for gas and electric were excessive in February, and significant unanticipated building repairs combined to produce a deficit for the month and YTD. Our other planned cost controls have been effective encouraging operating expense plans for the remainder of Spring and Summer.

Though we have had a strong start to 2024 Giving, we have not enjoyed this increase from all members. On one hand, 50 % of Zion Giving members are starting the year giving at a rate which is more than 110 % of their 2023 levels, and 70 % giving at a rate greater than 2023. This is very encouraging and in alignment with our objective to achieve our approved 2024 Spending Plan. On the contrary, 30% of Zion 2024 givers are giving at a reduced rate compared to 2023 and 20% of 2023 Givers have yet to give anything in 2024. We need support from all of you to positively resolve this situation and remain confident about achievement of 2024 ministry plans.

May God bless each of you during this Lenten season, and for your prayers of support in sharing God's Blessings to improve the lives of Zion members and the community in 2024 and beyond.

Lord, we continue to be humbled by the resources you make available to do your work at Zion and the inspiration you provide to recognize needs in our community and to appropriately respond to them. We do this in honor of your glorious name. Amen.

## Stark Hunger Walk - Feed the Need!



Witness Ministry - Sue Whalen and Ken Reinoehl

The idea of a **Prayer Initiative** stemmed from sessions in Adult Education following church. Pastor expressed how in a former church, a few members gathered to pray during the worship service, and he was able to tell when they stopped.

Pastor has also mentioned, several times since, how he would like to see it started here. We have expanded on the original prayer project and are asking ALL members to participate in following Paul's admonition in I Thessalonians 5:17, "Pray continually." All we are asking is for each member to PRAY DAILY, somewhere during your day, even if for only a minute. Stop and pray. If you wish a specific time, then try putting a setting on your phone for 8:26 [am or pm, or both], this will remind you to stop and pray. If you look at Romans 8:26 we read: "In the same way, the Spirit helps us in our weakness. We do not know what we ought to pray for, but the Spirit himself intercedes for us with groans that words cannot express."

This **PRAYER INITIATIVE**, will begin Easter morning, by handing out four colored cards with suggested prayers for different concerns. The white card will be <u>suggestions</u> for Daily Prayer. The blue card will be for prayers for worship, Wednesdays and Sundays, as-well -as at other times we worship. The yellow card is to remind us to pray for our ministry teams and council when they meet. And the orange card will remind us to pray for members birthdays and anniversaries. Periodically, additional cards will be handed out for special occasions, such as Vacation Bible Adventure (formerly VBS), the new school year, etc.

The cards are designed to get you started. You need not restrict yourself to the contents of the card,

nor is it necessary to use the whole card.

The most important thing is to "TAKE TIME TO PRAY!"

I look harmless enough nestled amongst these other household beverage containers don't I? But . . . I am known as a single-use plastic item doing my part in harming the soil, the air, and waterways--and ultimately, both human and animal health. There are so many of me everywhere!

You say you want to do away with me? HA! That would mean:

- 1.) Limit the production of single-use and virgin plastic with more dependence on recycling;
- 2.) Reduce consumer demand for convenience;
- 3.) Refrain from buying single-use beverage containers;
- 4.) Clean up littered roadsides, parks, ditches, etc.;
- 5.) Write to officeholders and policymakers;
- 6.) Learn through online resources, one of which is "Creation Justice." An ELCA representative, Christine Moffitt, is on the board.

Again, I say, "HA!"


